A building equipped to refine or process products such as oil, metals, or sugar.



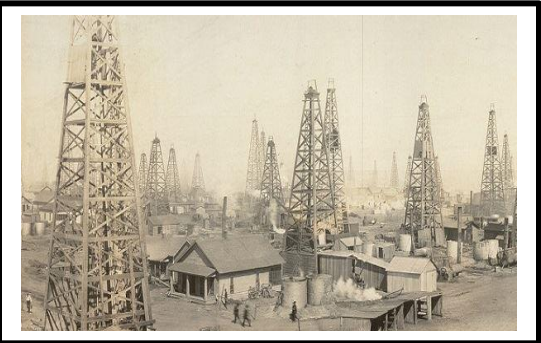
# Estimate

To provide a guess for an unknown quantity.



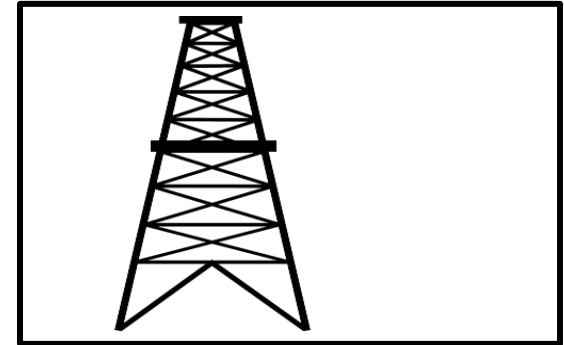
# Boomtown

A town that experiences sudden growth in population and business.



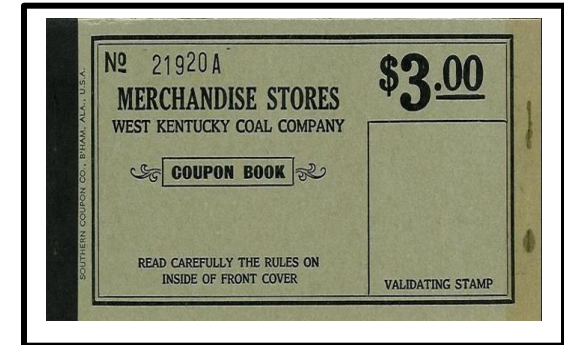
# Derrick

One of 12 district banks of the Federal Reserve, the central bank of the United States that manages the nation's money supply and banking system



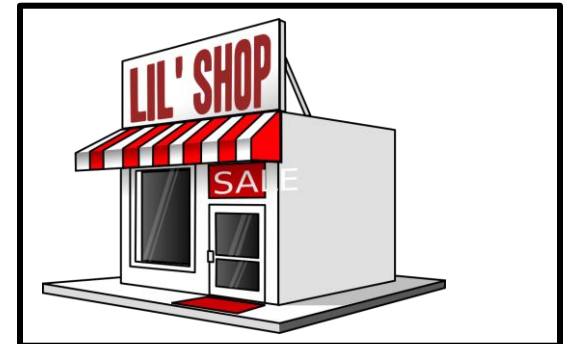
White

order to make money



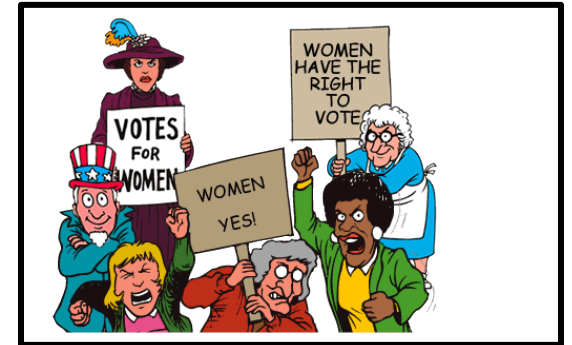
Craft
