- Worked 12-14 hour days



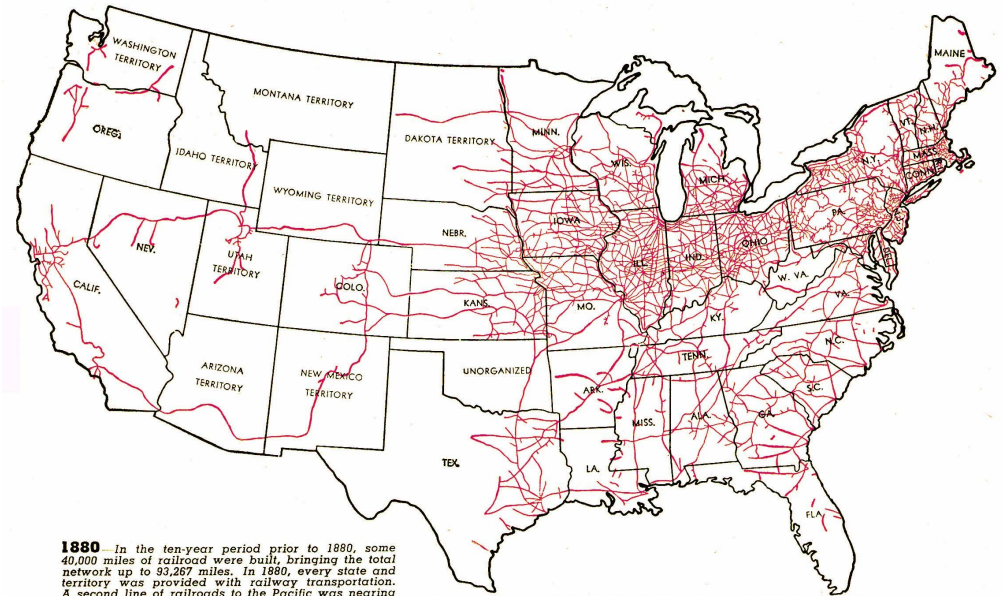
Cotton Gin

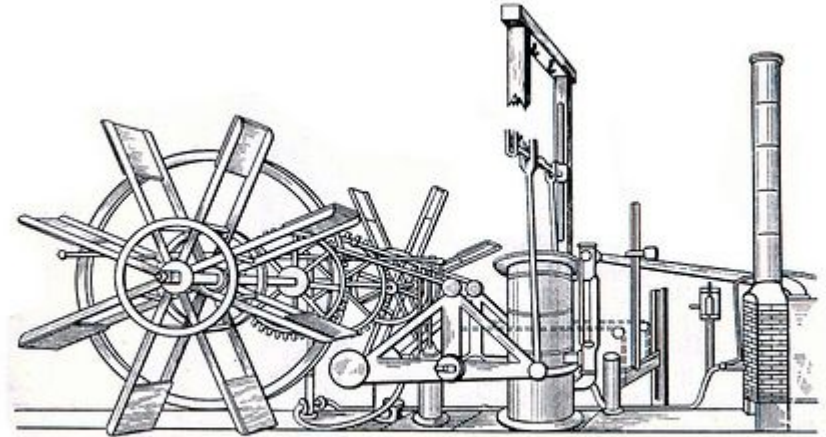
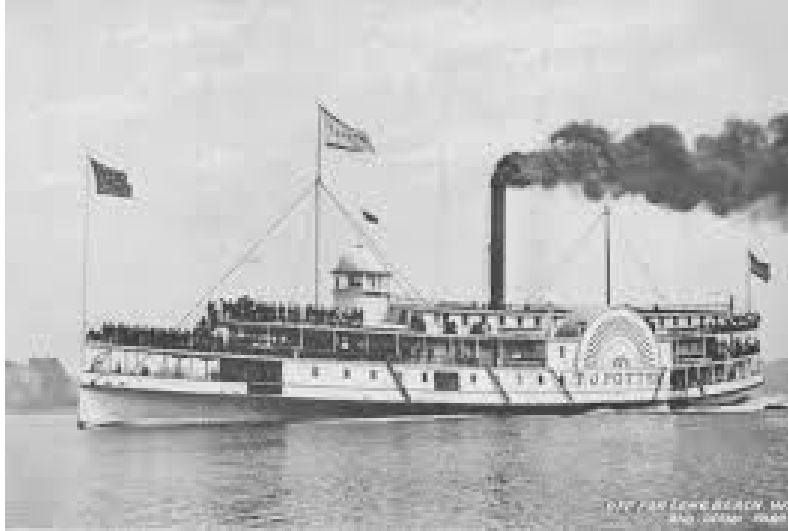


Railroads



1880 In the ten-year period prior to 1880, some 40,000 miles of railroad were built, bringing the total network up to 35,267 miles. In 1880, every state and territory was provided with railway transportation. A second line of railroads to the Pacific was nearing completion, and other transcontinental railroads were under construction. Railway development was exerting a powerful influence upon immigration and agricultural and industrial growth throughout the country.
