## Science Vocabulary Lunar Cycle

<u>Waxing-</u> To increase gradually in size, number, strength, or intensity.



**Waning-** To decrease gradually in size, amount, intensity, or degree; decline.



<u>Lunar Cycle-</u> An interval of time during which a characteristic, often regularly repeated event or sequence of events occurs of or relating to the moon.



Waxing Crescent- To increase gradually in size, number, strength, or intensity; the figure of the mood as it appears in its first or last quarter, with concave & convex edges termination in pint.



<u>Waning Gibbous</u>- To decrease gradually in six, number, strength, or intensity; more than half but less than full illuminated.



Waning Crescent- The figure of the moon as it appears in its first or last quarter, with concave and concave edges terminating in point; to decrease gradually in six, amount, intensity, or

degree; decline.



<u>Quarter</u>- one fourth of the period of the moon's revolution around Earth.



**Hemisphere-** A half a sphere bounded by a grate circle.



<u>Lunar Eclipse</u>- The earth passes between the sun and the moon.



<u>Gibbous</u>- The moon appears greater than one-half illuminated.



<u>Crescent</u>- The moon appears to be less than one-half illuminated.
