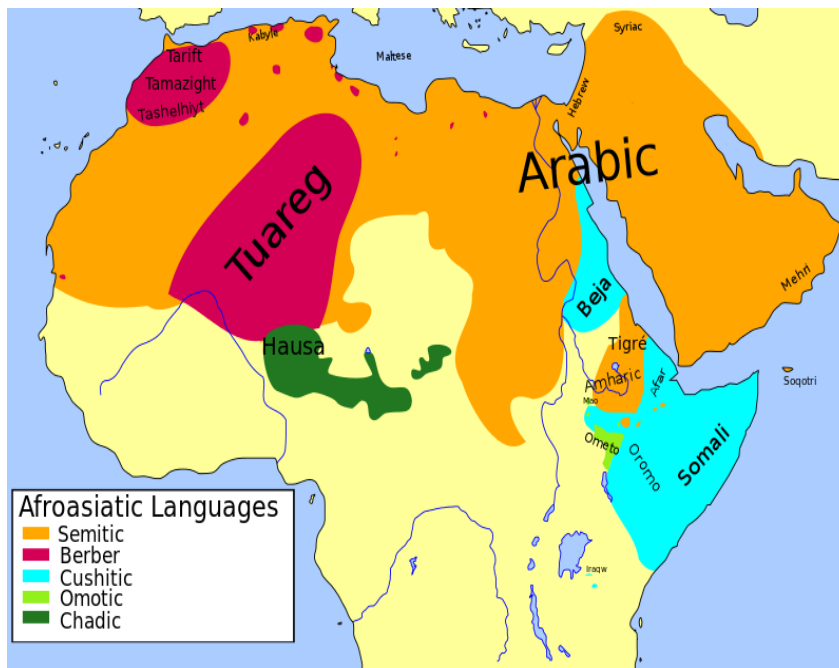

Contemporary Issues

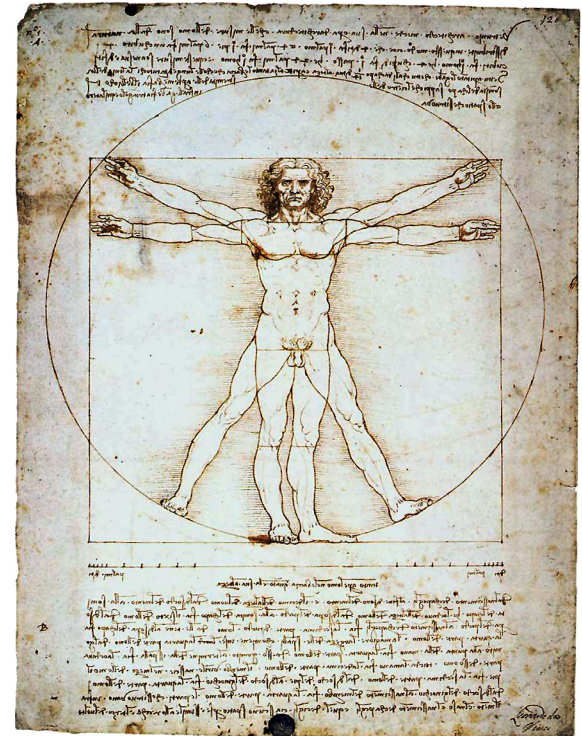


Example: people disagree about

Examples: Italian Renaissance, Greek / Roman Architecture, Shakespeare, French Impressionist art, Elvis Rock & Roll

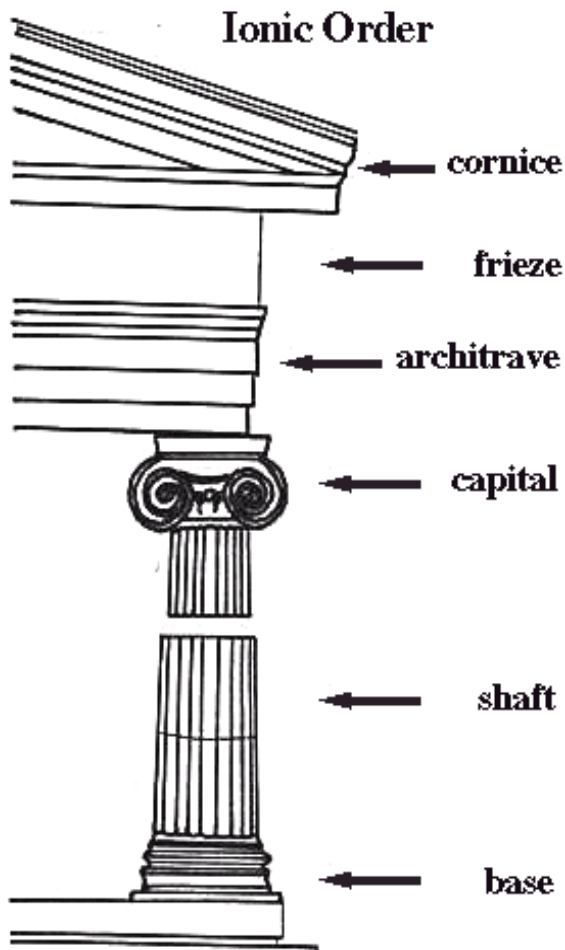
Art



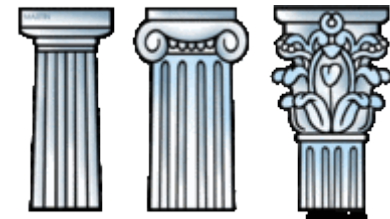

Architecture
