Citizen








a member of a community who owes loyalty to a community and government. They deserve to have their rights protected

Social contract Theory of Citizenship




A balance between individual rights such as the right to vote, and individual Responsibilities such as the duty to serve one's country

City—State



A state that has its own Government and consists of a city and the area around it

Subject



A person who is governed by a Monarch, who lives in the territory, who enjoys protection, and owes allegiance to a state.

Philosopher



A person who studies ideas about knowledge, truth, the nature and meaning of life

Republic



An independent state that is governed by elected representatives and by an elected leader

Direct Democracy



A form of government in which all laws are created by a general vote of society

Free-born



born to parents who are not slaves

Native-Born




Jus soli— the right of anyone born in the territory of a state to be a citizen of that state

Patrician



Wealthy land-owning Roman citizens who made less than 10% of Roman Republic. Upper Ruling Class held most of the power and control. They could serve in the senate

Plebian



The common people of ancient Rome. Merchants, farmers, and craft-workers who were not land owners. Eventually plebians elected tribunes to represent them.

Sentence or sentences that has the main point of your essay and tell the reader what the essay is going to be about


Thesis Statement Formula

Group of sentences that begins with a topic sentence and have sentences that support the main idea of the paragraph
